One of my favourite exhibitions is the Wildlife Photographer of the Year - held every winter at the National History Museum in London. When I used to live in the UK, I would always make time to drop by to see the exhibit, which is curated from tens of thousands of entries from both amateurs and established names down to 100 images.



Scottish wildlife photographer David Yarrow is one of this year's nominees, and is holding an exhibition at The Space from today until Sunday 24th November to coincide with the launch of his book Encounter. David has been photographing for nearly 30 years and is entirely self-taught. The book has been several years in the making, and includes 87 monochrome intimate portraits of wild animals and remote tribes in their natural habitats – often in some of the most inaccessible landscapes in the world. The stunning photos are complemented with insight into the environmental and geo-political matters surrounding his subjects.



Some of his photography prints are on display at The Space for the next few days. If you're looking for something to do this weekend, do drop in and take a look.
