



Long-time Kee contributing photographer Olaf Mueller stages his first solo exhibition entitled 'All Under Heaven' at The Cat Street Gallery from June 9th to July 9th, and he unveils his most adventurous work to date. Kee offers a preview of the stunning visual works.

h his latest exhibition 'All Under Heaven'. German-Korean photographer Olaf Mueller juxtaposes conventional photographic methods with modern digital tecŸologies to create surreal and visually potent compositions. Featuring 12 new works, in the new series Mueller takes as his subject the spectacular scenery of the Guangxi Zhuang a series of visually potent and critically successful fine art Autonomous Region of China.

journey of epic proportions, creating extraordinary shoots at a myriad of spectacular locations including the Li River, the Yulong River, the 1,000 year-old Xingping Town, Langzi In 2010, Mueller created a second body of artwork inspired Town near Yangshuo, the Silver Cave in Lipu County, the Longsheng Rice Terraces in Longsheng County and the Chengyang Wind-Rain Bridge in Sanjiang County.

Known for his hybrid process that is both physical and digital, Mueller has taken his aesthetic and ambitious location design to a new level in these site-specific works. His theatrical shoots throughout the region include floating villages, scores of local fishermen and the ethnic tribe known as the Yao Minority Ladies. The sublime landscapes and intriguing cast of characters the artist photographed were only the building blocks for a series of images which have been digitally sewn together to create a cornucopia

of detail. A key component of the series are the giant soap bubbles painstakingly created with industrial chemicals.

Mueller is one of the region's premier photographers and in 2009 he was catapulted into the Hong Kong art scene with works. Taking inspiration from the Dragon Garden Heritage site and featuring Kay Tse as his muse, the series entirely To prepare for the exhibition the artist undertook an artistic sold out setting a new precedent for photographic artwork at The Cat Street Gallery.
